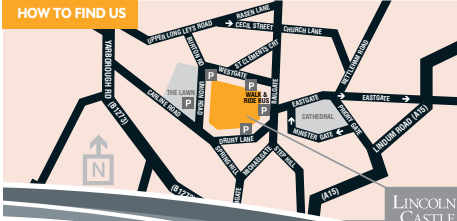

Access

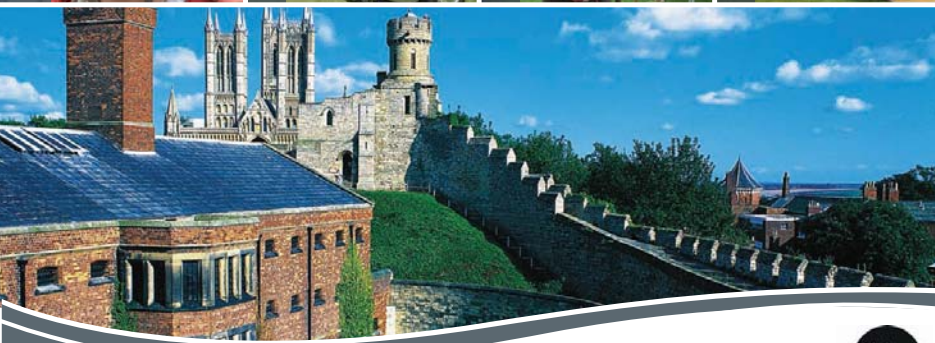
The site is partially accessible with an induction loop in the shop.
