

**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATIONS ACT 1984**  
**LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL**

**(ONE WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 2025**

The Lincolnshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on \_\_\_\_\_ and may be cited as the Lincolnshire County Council (Woodhall Spa – Coronation Road and King George Avenue) (One Way Traffic) Order 2025
2. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order in a direction other than that specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.

**STATEMENT OF REASONS**

- Lincolnshire County Council recently received a request to review vehicle movements on Coronation Road, Spa Road and King George Avenue, Woodhall Spa, where the Planning and Regulation Committee approved a one-way system that had an exemption for cyclists.
- Following site investigations carried out by the surfacing and drainage teams, a wider carriageway width can no longer be achieved as previously anticipated.
- Therefore, to keep cyclists safe along the new one-way system it is proposed to remove the exemption for cyclists from the previous one-way order, meaning under the new proposal they must adhere to the one-way system.
- The Chief Constable, Woodhall Spa Parish Council and East Lindsey District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.
