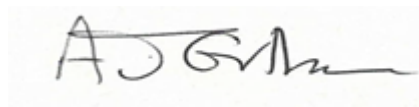
On 16 July 2026 Lincolnshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to temporarily divert the whole width of part of Public Footpath No. 7 in the parish of Eagle running from an unaffected part of Public Footpath No. 7 at OSGR SK 8772 6642 (A) in a generally southerly direction for approximately 290 metres to terminate at an unaffected part of Public Footpath No. 7 at OSGR SK 8773 6614 (B). The total length of footpath to be diverted to be approximately 290 metres as shown between points A-B on Order plan numbered 2025/031/PPO394/A4 TO AN ALTERNATIVE ROUTE in the parish of Eagle at a varying width of between 1.5 metres and 2 metres running from an unaffected part of Public Footpath No. 7 at OSGR SK 8772 6642 (A) in a generally south west then south south westerly direction for approximately 353 metres to OSGR SK 8753 6613 (C) then curving in a generally south south easterly then south easterly direction for approximately 113 metres to OSGR SK 8762 6607 (D) then curving in a generally easterly through to north north easterly direction for approximately 107 metres to OSGR SK 8769 6615 (E) then running in a generally east south easterly direction for approximately 47 metres to terminate at the unaffected part of Public Footpath No. 7 at OSGR SK 8773 6614 (B). The total length of footpath to be added to be approximately 620 metres as shown between points A-C-D-E-B on Order plan numbered 2025/031/PPO394/A4.

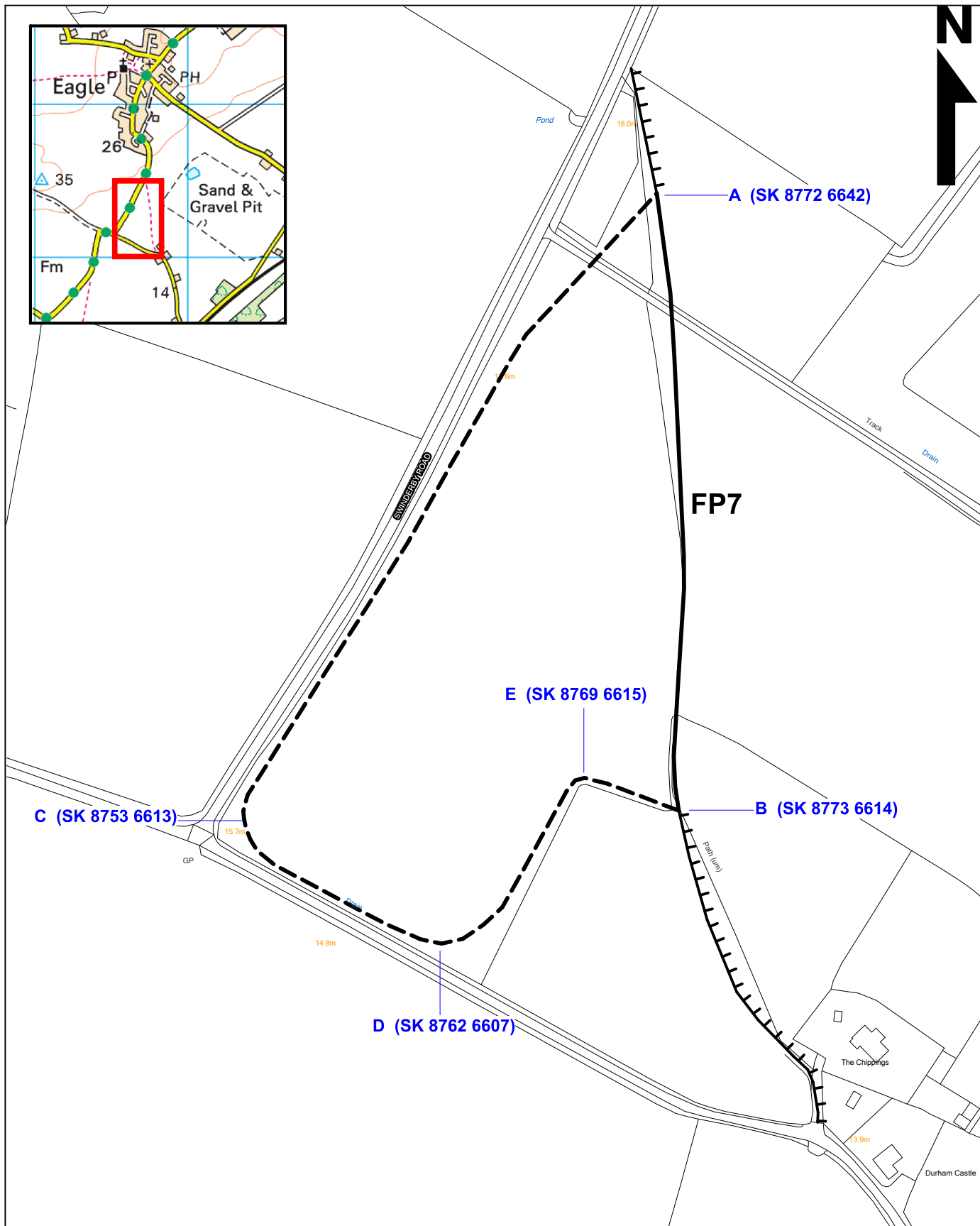
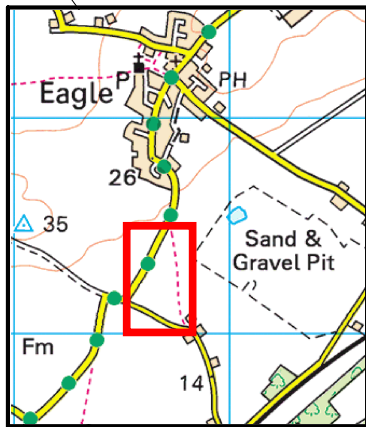

The confirmed Order came into force as from 16 July 2026, the date that Lincolnshire County Council confirmed that the terms of Article 2 of the Order had been complied with and that the alternative route has been constructed to a satisfactory standard. If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within 6 weeks from the date on which the notice is first published (13 August 2026) as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to the Act.

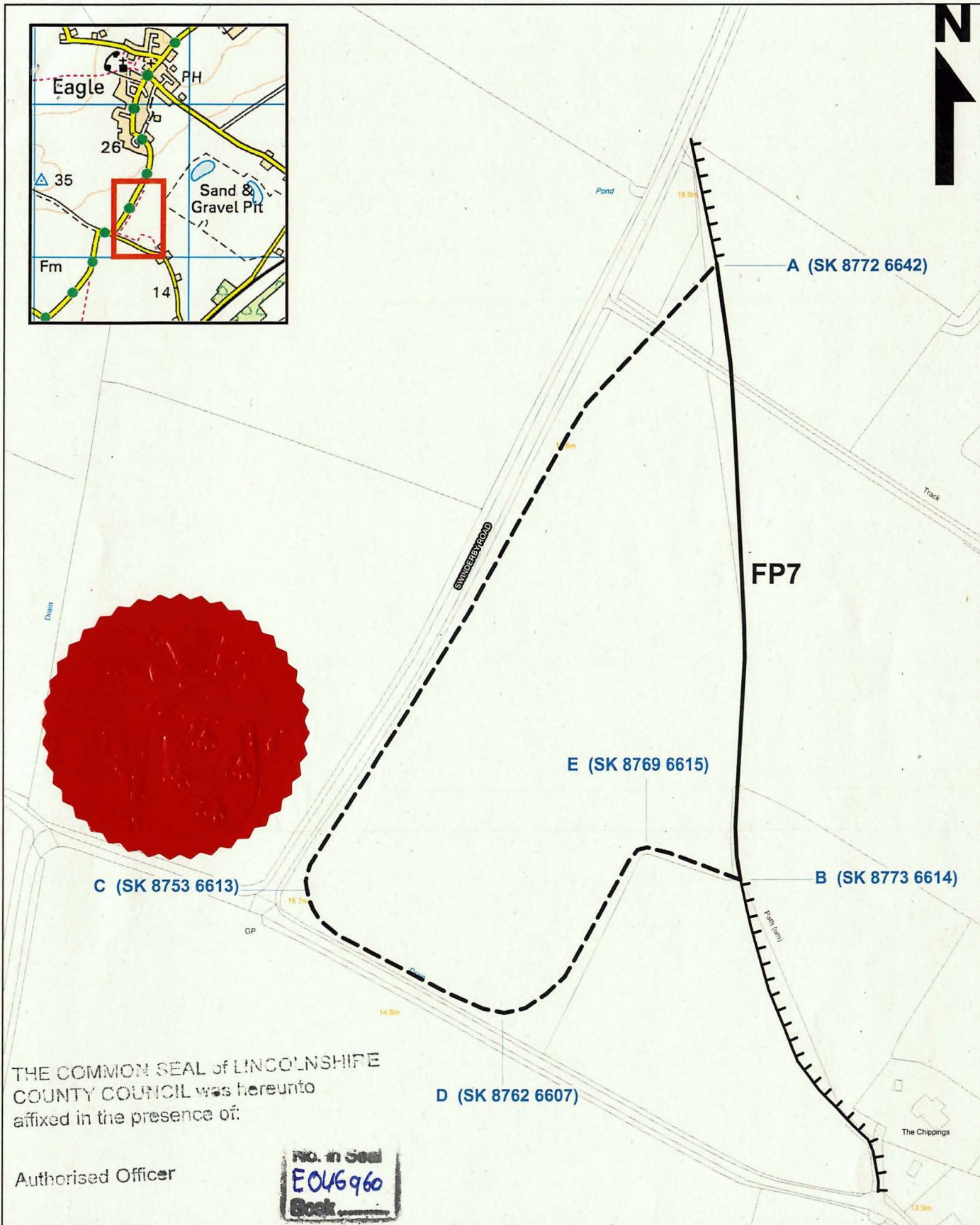
PUBLIC FOOTPATH NUMBER 7 EAGLE

This Order is made by Lincolnshire County Council under section 261 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 because it is satisfied that it is necessary to temporarily divert the footpath to which this Order relates for the purpose of enabling minerals to be worked by surface working at Whisby Pit Quarry, Eagle pursuant to planning permission No. N23/27/64/0385/1, and that the footpath can be restored after the minerals have been worked to a condition not substantially less convenient to the public. The diversion shall have effect for a period of five years ('the Period'), beginning on the date on which Lincolnshire County Council certifies that the requirements of Article 2 of this Order have been complied with.

BY THIS ORDER:

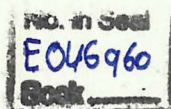
1. The footpath over the land at Eagle shown by a bold black line on the attached plan and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order ("the Schedule") shall be diverted as provided below.
2. There shall be created to the reasonable satisfaction of Lincolnshire County Council an alternative highway for use as a replacement for the said footpath as provided in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by bold black dashes on the attached plan

3. The temporary diversion of the footpath shall have effect on the date on which Lincolnshire County Council certify that the terms of Article 2 above have been complied with.
4. Before the expiration of the Period Tarmac Trading Limited shall to the reasonable satisfaction of the Authority carry out such works of reconstruction as may be necessary to secure the restoration of the footpath referred to in Article 1 above to a condition not substantially less convenient to the public.
5. At the expiration of the said Period, and upon the Authority certifying that the terms of Article 4 have been complied with, the footpath referred to in Article 2 above and described in Part 2 of the Schedule shall be stopped up and the footpath referred to in Article 1 above shall be restored to public use.
6. Tarmac Trading Limited is required to pay the costs of or undertake the above mentioned works referred to in Article 4.
7. Where immediately before the date on which the footpath is diverted there is apparatus under, in, on, over, along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of carrying on their undertaking, the undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they then had.

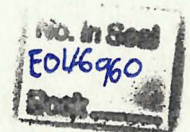

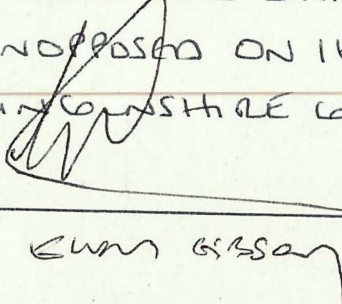
