

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lincolnshire County Council propose to make an Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting at the junction of Rycroft Avenue/Broadgate Lane and introduce limited waiting in front of the shops..

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

- Concerns have been expressed regarding parking on Rycroft Avenue in the vicinity of the shops and at the junction of Rycroft Avenue with Broadgate Lane.
- It is therefore proposed to introduce double yellow lines at the junction and Introduction of double yellow lines to facilitate traffic movements. Introducing limited waiting to allow a turnover of parking outside the shops.
- The proposals will improve traffic flows at the junction of Rycroft Avenue and Broadgate Lane and assist with access to local amenities.
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Council's Policy, it is proposed to prohibit waiting as set out on the plans to the Order.
- The Chief Constable, Deeping St James Parish Council and South Kesteven
 District Council have been consulted, along with other local
 groups/companies.
