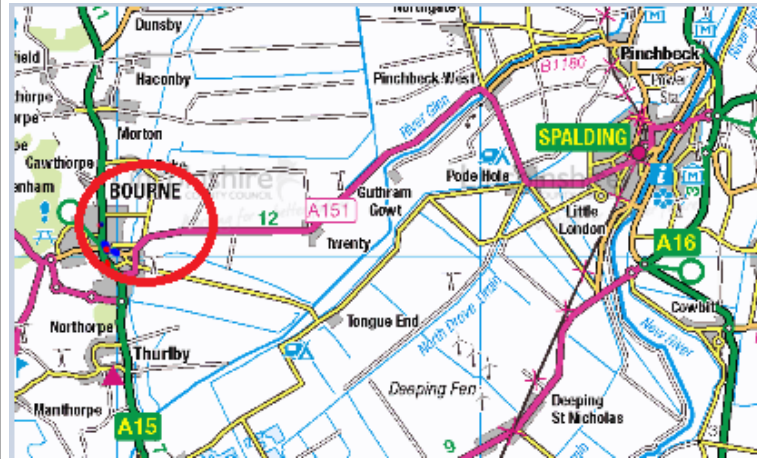


**LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(BOURNE – SOUTH ROAD)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AMENDMENT ORDER 20**

STATEMENT OF REASONS

- Following investigations at the above mentioned location it was found that there is an increased need for restrictions to facilitate traffic flow.
- The proposals will remove any obstruction of the highway by parked vehicles, facilitate traffic flow and improve visibility and road safety for all users.
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Council's Policy, it is proposed to prohibit waiting as set out on the Plans to the Order.
- The Chief Constable, Bourne Town Council and South Kesteven District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.

LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (BOURNE – SOUTH ROAD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AMENDMENT ORDER 20

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lincolnshire County Council propose to make an Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to:

- Extend the current No Waiting at Any Time on the east side of South Road in the vicinity of Austerby
- Establish No Waiting at Any Time on the west side of South Road from South Street to opposite its junction with Austerby
- Establish No Waiting at Any Time at the junction of South Road and Coggles Causeway
- Establish No Stopping Except Buses 6.00am to 9.00pm in the vicinity of numbers 17 to 19 South Road and number 6 South Road

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.
