

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lincolnshire County Council propose to make an Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting at the following junctions; Allwood Road/Ryland Road, Honeyholes Lane/Ryland Road and Watery Lane/Ryland Road.

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

- Lincolnshire County Council recently received a request to review the waiting restrictions at the above location in the vicinity of Dunholme Primary School.
- Investigations have shown that junctions are obstructed on a regular basis resulting in conflicts. Vehicles have been observed needing to reverse back onto Ryland Road in order to facilitate traffic movement.
- The proposals will remove any obstruction of the highway by parked vehicles and improve visibility and road safety for all users.
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Council's Policy, it is proposed to prohibit waiting as set out on the Plans to the Order.
- The Chief Constable, Dunholme Parish Council and West Lindsey District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.
