This application is based principally on the Ancaster enclosure award which both awards theroad as a carriageway and makes it clear that it then already existed along the "usual course of an antient road". In addition the name Pottergate is the name of an antient road running all the way from Lincoln to Ancaster. The name is Danish in origin. Pottergate is clearly an old public road of some importance in past times.
