CONDITIONS (INCLUDING REASONS) / REASONS FOR REFUSAL

This proposal is for the change of use to site 43 no. holiday use static caravans on the site of the existing golf course at Addlethorpe Golf Club. It is proposed to utilise the existing access from Chapel Lane which is sufficient for two-way vehicular movements and offers suitable visibility in either direction, which exceeds the minimum requirements in accordance with Manual for Streets. The alignment of Chapel Lane is relatively straight and benefits from forward visibility.

The application was supported by a Transport Statement and the greatest predicted two way vehicle movements associated with the proposed holiday lodge development is no greater than 19 vehicle movements with the average being 14 vehicle movements per hour over the entire day.

The detailed information concludes that no significant impact will occur on the existing local highway network.

As Lead Local Flood Authority, Lincolnshire County Council is required to provide a statutory planning consultation response with regard to Drainage on all Major Applications. The Lead Local Flood Authority does not consider that this proposal would increase flood risk in the immediate vicinity of the site.

Public Rights of Way

An extensive Public Right of Way network is available within proximity to the site, however, an opportunity to improve the network has been identified. It is intended to provide opportunities for access and it is recommended that a Public Right of Way should be dedicated across this development.
