- 2. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30mph on the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40mph on the length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3 (4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3 (5) of those regulations.
- Any existing restriction or requirement made or having effect as if made under the
 Act of 1984 is hereby revoked insofar as it relates to the lengths and sides of the
 roads specified in this Order.
