# ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (FOTHERBY- LOUTH ROAD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AMENDMENT ORDER 20

THE LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2(1) and (2), 3, 4, 5, 32, 35, 45, 46, 49, 53,124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the Act of 1984) as amended and the Traffic Management Act 2004 (the Act of 2004) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order.

- This Order shall come into operation on 20 and may be cited as the Lincolnshire County Council (Fotherby – Louth Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Amendment Order 20
- The Lincolnshire County Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading and Parking Places) (Civil Enforcement and Consolidation) Order 2012 Plans including the key (the 'Plans') are incorporated into this Order.
- Plan TF136781 of the Lincolnshire County Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading and Parking Places) (Civil Enforcement and Consolidation) Order 2012 shall be amended.
- 4. Any restriction or requirement made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or any other enactment is hereby revoked insofar as it relates to the length and sides of road specified in this Order.

5. The prohibition imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

### LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (FOTHERBY – LOUTH ROAD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AMENDMENT ORDER 20

#### **STATEMENT OF REASONS**

- Following investigations at the above mentioned location it was found that visibility and safe exiting of buses from the bus stop was impeded due to vehicles parked/waiting where buses exit north onto Louth Road and in the vicinity of Church Lane reducing the safety for all road users.
- The introduction of a formal Traffic Regulation Order will discourage parking/waiting on the no loading markings and enable civil parking enforcement officers to issue Penalty Charge Notices where appropriate.
- The proposals will facilitate traffic flow, ensure all accesses are kept clear, improve the safety and visibility of the Church Lane junction and the Louth Road bus stop as well as improving visibility and road safety for all users.
- Therefore, it is proposed to prohibit waiting and loading as set out on the Plans to the Order.
- The Chief Constable and East Lindsey District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.





## LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (FOTHERBY – LOUTH ROAD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AMENDMENT ORDER 20 BUS STOP CLEARWAY

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lincolnshire County Council propose to make an Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to propose:

- No waiting at Any Time north of the bus stop and at the junction of Church Lane and Louth Road
- A bus stop clearway will be established in its existing location

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.
