Parties exchanging: Etheldred Ann Birch Reynardson, widow, and Revd John Birch Reynardson, rector of Careby. Property exchanged: all in Careby (plan attached). i). Given by Mrs Reynardson: two intake closes, Incroft close, Freestones, cottage and paddock, part of Pancake meadow, part of Paddock Old Road. ii). Given by Revd JB Reynardson: three Calves Closes. Seal of Inclosure Commissioners; signatures	27 Feb 1850

Property exchanged: (plan annexed) i). Mrs Reynardson gives: 2 Careby closes, Bowling Green, parts of Fourteen acres, Stonepit, Sixteen acres and Pancake Meadow, all in Careby. ii). Revd JB Reynardson gives: Gorse Close, Hill, Barn Close, Stone pit close and stonepit in Aunby. Seal of the tithe commissioners, G Darby and William Blamire signed the original.</p>	22 Nov 1852
<b>CAREBY PAR/5/3</b>	<p><u>Office copy of an order of exchange by the Inclosure Commissioners</u> Parties: Charles Thomas Samuel Birch Reynardson and Revd JB Reynardson. Lands exchanged (plans): i). CTS Birch Reynardson gives: 1 acre and 33 perches near the Great Northern Railway in Careby, and 5 acres, 1 rood and 15 perches near the Careby glebe in Little Bytham. ii). Revd JB Reynardson gives: Horse Garth in Addlethorpe.</p>	1 July 1858

(whose wife was Jane Bertie Mathew), and Elizabeth, Harriet and Caroline Bertie Mathew, now of Rome, sisters and heiresses of Bertie Bertie Mathew, covenanted to Revd John Birch Reynardson.

Subject of covenant: 7 acres and 12 roods of copyhold land in Addlethorpe, purchased by Reynardson for £400.

Schedule of deeds 1824-1858.

Signatures and seals of grantors.

Witnessed by Edward Morris Erskine, Secretary to the British Legation.

<b>CAREBY PAR/5/5/3</b>	<p><u>Covenant to surrender to the uses of the rectory of Careby</u> To make a proper title. Surrender by Revd JB Reynardson, rector of Careby, and Sophie his wife, to Francis Charles Greenfield. Property: land in Careby and Little Bytham obtained by exchange in CAREBY PAR/5/2 and purchased with money from the Great Northern Railway under an order in Chancery. This land held of the manor of Ingoldmells and Addlethorpe. With plan and signature of grantors.</p>	14 Feb 1866
<b>CAREBY PAR/5/5/4</b>	<p><u>Surrender of copyhold land</u> Manor of Ingoldmells and Addlethorpe. Revd JB Reynardson surrenders to Mr FC Greenfield, in trust for himself as rector. Property as in 3. Signatures of Mr and Mrs Reynardson.</p>	14 Feb 1866
